

International Guild of Town Pipers

Bringing history to life

From medieval times up to the early 19th century, European towns and cities employed bands of civic musicians. Duties included playing through the town at night, waking townsfolk on dark winter mornings by playing in the street, and playing for civic occasions. The International Guild of Town Pipers exists to promote interest in the history and music of the Town Pipers and to encourage the formation of new performing groups. We maintain a website, which has extensive information on the history of waits and the modern revival bands.



Town pipers are known as Waits in England, Stadspijpers in the Netherlands, Stadtpfeifer in Germany and Pifferi in Italy Every two years we organise a Waits' Festival, where multiple bands of pipers/Waits gather for a weekend to meet, swap ideas, and perform. Members of the guild range from individuals and academics to gifted amateurs and professional musicians.

2026 will be the year of our 11th festival and we are looking for a city or town to help us host the event. Past festivals have been held in York, Lincoln, Kings Lynn, Worcester, Gloucester and 's Hertogenbosch in the Netherlands.



Our bands perform on replicas of period instruments and wear clothing of the era they represent. The Town Pipers of old provided entertainment to the citizens of their town and our aim is to continue this tradition by providing free outdoor musical performances during our festivals.



The Festival of the IGTP



Our charity's objectives are "to advance the education for the public benefit in Early Music" and the festival is one of the ways that we accomplish this.

At our last festival, the guild provided 36 free performances around the centre of the host city, culminating in the "Great Noyse", a concert by all of the 60 musicians taking part. These performances brought to life the historical locations in which they were staged and helped to attract a new audience both to the location and to the music performed. We were also able to provide a band to accompany the cathedral choir and together they performed a renaissance motet at morning mass on Sunday. This was followed by a musical parade through the city centre by all participants.

An outline festival programme

Friday

Bands arrive, evening rehearsal and reception.

Saturday

Bands play around the host city or town at preagreed locations and times. Evening social event for participants.

Sunday
